




The above graph reflects the total reported incidents per month since May 2021.

For the period, 1-31 May 2023 there were 42 incidents reported.

SUMMARY:





Thefts recorded the highest number of incidents (28) broken down as follows –theft of motor vehicle (3), theft out of motor vehicle (4), general theft (10), attempted theft (1), attempted theft out of motor vehicle (3), theft of car parts (4), theft of motor cycle (3).

Other reported crimes were robberies / muggings (7), attempted muggings (1), burglary (5), and attempted burglary (1).

May 2023

Proactive engagement (e.g. reports of suspicious activity / persons / vehicles) from the community went slightly up compared to the previous month (38 reports, 2 more received by the Control Room during April 2023).

The OBSID public safety team have to inform owners or residents of unlocked vehicles, open doors, and open garages or premises gates. OBSID's public safety team recorded 379 proactive incidents this month.




INCIDENTS V. PROACTIVE ACTIONS BY THE PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS:

- 22 May 2023 Nuttall Road, theft out of motor vehicle


TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY AND MAP:




INCIDENTS OF CONCERN:

 Vehicle related theft (17) (theft of motor vehicle, theft out of motor vehicle, theft of car parts and attempted theft out of motor vehicle);




• Housebreaking (6) (burglaries residential, business and attempts);

• Robbery (8) (muggings, robbery with a weapon other than a firearm and armed robbery);




SUMMARY OF ACTIVE PERIODS FOR THE MONTH:

Highest incident periods: (19) incidents were reported as occurring during the week (Monday to Thursday) and (23) incidents over the weekend (Friday to Sunday).


The high number of late reports makes it difficult to accurately determine when incidents occurred – however it appears as if the majority of incidents took place between 18h00 – 06h00.

INCIDENTS BY DAY:








• OBS Red 1, recorded 11 incidents (9) reported the previous month – 85 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:


 OBS Red 2, recorded 7 incidents (11) reported the previous month – 78 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:



 Blue 1, recorded 2 incidents (5) reported the previous month – 46 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:






 Blue 3, recorded 4 incidents (3) reported the previous month – 31 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:

 Yellow recorded 4 incidents (5) reported the previous month – 25 proactive actions had to be conducted in this area:




